What do I do if I am exposed to someone with COVID-19?

If working in California ONLY

I have been exposed

Shared the same indoor airspace (e.g., meeting, workspace, lab, home) with an infected person for ≥15 mins over 24-hr period You may continue to come on site **ONLY** if you:


- 1. Do not have symptoms, and
- 2. Wear a well-fitted mask 1 for 10 days, and
- 3. Test on day 6. Day 0 is the day of your last exposure.
 - If your exposure is a positive household member, test on day 6 and day 13.
 - If you already had COVID
 - Within the last 30 days: Test only if you are symptomatic.
 - Within 31-90 days: Take an antigen test on day 6.
 - Report positive results to the <u>Security Control Center</u>. If negative, send results to <u>EHS</u> (instructions <u>here</u>).

You only need to report to the SCC if you test positive



What do I do if I am exposed to someone with COVID-19?

Working outside California



You may continue to come on site **ONLY** if you:

- 1. Do not have symptoms, and
- 2. Wear a well-fitted mask¹ for 10 days, and
- 3. Test on day 6. Day 0 is the day of your last exposure.
 - If your exposure is a positive household member, test on day 6 and day 13.
 - If you already had COVID
 - Within the last 30 days: Test only if you are symptomatic.
 - Within 31-90 days: Take an antigen test on day 6.
 - Report positive results to the <u>Security Control Center</u>.

You only need to report to the SCC if you test positive



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
